

Privacy Policy for United in One Global Foundation

Last Updated: July 28, 2026

1. Introduction

United in One Global Foundation ("United in One," "we," "us," or "our") is committed to protecting the privacy of our donors, supporters, and website visitors. This Privacy Policy explains how we collect, use, store, and disclose information when you interact with our website, located at [Website Address], and its related services (collectively, the "Website").

This policy is designed to be transparent and help you understand your rights regarding your personal information. By using our Website, you consent to the data practices described in this policy.

2. Information We Collect

We collect information to operate effectively and provide you with the best experience. The information we collect may include:

- **Personal Information You Provide:** This is information that identifies you as an individual. We collect it when you make a donation, sign up for our newsletter, or contact us. This may include your name, email address, mailing address, and phone number. If you make a donation using the Website, we may collect payment card or financial account information, which is stored securely by a third party payment processors.
- **Sensitive Information:** We do not intentionally collect sensitive information such as race or ethnicity, political opinions, health, or similar categories unless specifically requested with your express consent. Please avoid submitting such information unless we ask for it.
- **Information About Minors:** Our Website is not intended for children under the age of 16. We do not knowingly collect information from individuals under 16 years old. If we discover such data, we will promptly delete it.
- **Location Information:** Some features may request or utilize location information, such as geolocation data for event participation or comment features. Any location data is opt-in and managed through your device or browser settings.
- **Passive Information Collection:** We may automatically collect technical and usage information from your browser or device, such as your IP address, device type, operating system, screen resolution, browser type and version, referring URLs, and general geographical location.

- **Cookies and Tracking Technologies:** We use cookies and similar technologies to improve user experience, collect analytics, remember preferences, and personalize content. You can manage cookie settings in your browser, though some features may not work if cookies are disabled.
- **Social Media Features:** Our Website may include social media widgets or plugins that collect certain data through cookies or similar means according to the policies of those platforms.

3. How We Use Your Information

We use the information we collect for the following purposes:

- **To Process Transactions:** To process your donations, send you tax-deductible receipts, and manage our financial records.
- **To Communicate with You:** To send you updates about our mission, programs, and impact, as well as newsletters and fundraising appeals. If you donate, you may be automatically enrolled in our newsletter. You can opt out at any time.
- **To Provide Requested Services:** To fulfill your requests, respond to inquiries, and facilitate your participation in events, surveys, or campaigns.
- **To Improve Our Website and Services:** To analyze how visitors use our Website, understand trends, and improve the user experience, functionality, and content.
- **To Fulfill Legal Obligations:** To comply with applicable laws, regulations, legal processes, or enforce our Terms of Use.
- **To Promote Our Mission:** To share news, initiatives, and events related to our work, and to highlight the impact of donations and partnerships.
- **For Business Purposes:** Such as data analysis, audits, recordkeeping, developing new products or services, website optimization, and measuring the effectiveness of our programs and communications.
- **Automated Processing:** We may use automated tools to personalize communications or tailor content and donor engagement; you can contact us if you wish to object to automated processing.

4. Lawful Basis for Processing Your Personal Information

Depending on your location, we process your personal information on the following bases:

- Your consent
- To fulfill a contract or transaction requested by you

- To comply with our legal obligations
- For our legitimate interests, such as improving services, securing the Website, or furthering our mission (provided these interests do not override your rights)

5. Sharing Your Information

Your privacy is important to us. We do not sell, rent, or trade our donor lists with other organizations. We may share your information as follows:

- **With Service Providers:** We share information with trusted third-party partners performing services on our behalf, such as payment processing, data analysis, email delivery, marketing, event management, cloud hosting, or website security. These partners must protect your data and use it only for the stated purposes.
- **With Affiliates or Partners:** We may share information with nonprofit partners for collaborative events or initiatives, in accordance with this Privacy Policy and applicable law.
- **For Legal or Safety Reasons:** To comply with legal requirements, processes, or enforce our Terms of Use; to protect United in One, its users, or the public from harm; or as part of an organizational restructuring, merger, or asset sale.

6. Data Security

We implement reasonable administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to protect your personal information from unauthorized access, use, or disclosure. This includes security measures such as firewalls, encryption via SSL/TLS, and use of PCI-compliant payment processors for donations. While we strive to use industry-standard methods, no data transmission or storage can be guaranteed 100% secure.

7. Data Retention

We retain your personal information only as long as necessary to fulfill the purposes described in this policy, fulfill legal obligations, resolve disputes, or enforce agreements. The retention period depends on the type of information, our requirements, and applicable law.

8. Your Rights and Choices

You have rights regarding your personal information, which may include:

- **Access and Update:** Request access to the personal information we hold about you and ask us to correct or update it.
- **Opt-Out:** Unsubscribe from our marketing and fundraising communications at any time by clicking the "unsubscribe" link at the bottom of our emails, contacting us, or managing settings in your online profile.

- **Restrict or Delete:** Request restriction on how we use your information or request deletion, except where retention is required by law.
- **Object to Automated Processing:** Ask not to be subject to automated processing for certain purposes.

You can exercise these rights by contacting us using the information provided in the Contact section.

9. Cookies and Tracking Technologies

We use cookies and other tracking technologies to collect non-personal information about your browsing activities and enhance your experience. You can control the use of cookies in your browser at any time.

10. Third-Party Links

Our Website may contain links to other websites or services not operated by us. We are not responsible for their content or privacy practices. We recommend you review the privacy policies of all third-party sites you visit.

11. Where Your Information Is Processed

United in One is based in the United States. By using our Website, you understand your data will be processed and stored in the U.S. If you are accessing from outside the U.S., different privacy protections may apply.

12. Right to Change This Policy

We may update this Privacy Policy from time to time to reflect changes to our data practices, Website features, or for legal or operational reasons. The "Last Updated" date at the top will be revised accordingly. Your continued use of the Website constitutes acceptance of any changes. We encourage you to review this policy periodically.

13. State Charitable Solicitation Disclosure

Some of the personal information described in this Policy, such as your name, address, and donation history, is collected and retained in part to comply with state charitable solicitation registration and reporting laws. United in One is registered to solicit charitable contributions in Florida and welcomes donations from residents of every state. Details on our multi-state registration status, and the required state disclosure statements, are set out in the Charitable Solicitation Disclosure section of our Terms of Use, which is incorporated into this Policy by reference.

14. Privacy Rights for Residents of California and Other States

Because we accept donations and communicate with supporters located throughout the United States, residents of California and other states with their own privacy laws may have additional rights regarding personal information, which may include the right to know what personal information we have collected about you, the right to request deletion of your personal information (subject to legal recordkeeping requirements for donation and tax records), the right to correct inaccurate personal information, and the right to be free from discrimination for exercising these rights. United in One does not sell personal information and does not share personal information for cross-context behavioral advertising. To exercise any of these rights, please contact us using the information in the Contact Information section below, and we will respond within the time required by applicable law.

15. Photos, Videos, Media, Testimonials Submitted

From time to time, schools, community groups, nonprofit partners, field partners, and other organizations we work with may reach out to us and submit photographs, videos, testimonials, or similar media, for example depicting our programs, initiatives, or the communities we serve. By submitting such media to United in One, the submitting school, organization, or individual represents that it has the necessary rights and, where applicable, the consent of any individuals depicted, to share those materials with us for the uses described below.

United in One may use photos, videos, testimonials, and other media submitted to us for fundraising campaigns, donation requests and appeals, grant applications, newsletters, social media, our website, and other promotional or programmatic purposes, in any media, without compensation to the submitting school, organization, or individual, unless otherwise agreed in writing. United in One does not need to have provided funding, sponsorship, or any other support to a school, community, or organization in order to use the media it submits. The act of submitting photos, videos, or other media to United in One is, by itself, sufficient to grant the rights described in this section, regardless of whether United in One has any funding relationship, partnership, or program connection with the submitting school, community, or organization.
